tending a college with rolling admissions should contact the school's admissions office and ask if applications are still being accepted. Not all rolling admissions procedures are the same.

Applying late under a rolling admissions policy may help procrastinating seniors get accepted to college, but the student is much less likely to receive financial aid. Merit-based scholarship applications are generally due in November and December, and many schools require FAFSA information by February or March. Contact the college's financial aid office for details.
