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The Value of an SAT Score

We all know that an SAT score is part of the college admission package, but do you realize the impact of the score on the financial award? Many students need to answer just a few more questions correctly to earn academic grants. A few hundred points can add up to thousands of

dollars. Using the net price calculator for a public, in-state school, a combined math and verbal score of 1050 with a GPA of 3.2, results in a merit-aid award of \$3,950. If the SAT score improves to 1320, the award increases to \$6,350. Adding a GPA of 3.75 to

the 1320 results in a scholarship of \$8,000! That funding continues for four years with academic performance. Not all schools have the same incentives, but most have money to support students who earn the scores. What is the value of an SAT score? How does \$15,800 to \$32,000 sound? Focused preparation pays!

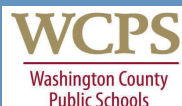
