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Program Description:

Students with aptitudes for and interests in the humanities (literature, social sciences, history of the arts) will enjoy this program. Magnet program students take specialized, cross curricular English Language Arts and social studies classes that infuse the magnet theme into the curriculum. These courses, which move at an accelerated pace one to two years above grade level in terms of complexity, utilize the William & Mary curriculum for gifted and talented students, incorporating a wide selection of both classical and modern literature. Students will take deep dives into primary source materials to interpret their historical importance and impact on our changing world. Each summer, students complete a multi-disciplinary project that allows them to extend their learning and hit the ground running at the start of the next school year. The ultimate goal of this magnet program is to not only provide students with the skills necessary to be successful in advanced placement opportunities in high school and beyond, but more importantly to prepare them to participate as informed, critically-minded global citizens. Students are granted unique academic experiences that encourage analytical thinking and creativity.
